


Welcome to Raddlebarn Primary School

Home Visits

Home visits for all children will be carried out in September.

What is a home visit?

During a home visit, two members of staff from Raddlebarn school will pay a quick visit to your house. Where possible, it will usually be your child's teacher and teaching assistant.

There is no need to worry, set anything up or do anything out of the ordinary. We will just come briefly to play with your child, have a chat to you to share information and answer any queries you have. It usually lasts 10-15 minutes.

Why do you do them?

Home visits are really beneficial for both you and your child, as well as teachers. It gives your child an opportunity to get to know us, and equally for us to get to know them. It is reassuring for them to see a familiar face on their first day of school

It gives teacher and parent a chance to talk, discuss any medical information, dietary requirements or worries you may have.

Will I be given a specific time?

You will provided with a date and time slot. We will let you know the day will we will come and whether it will be morning (Between 9-11:45) or the afternoon (between 1—3:30)

School Uniform



- Raddlebarn burgundy jumper or cardigan
- Yellow/gold Raddlebarn polo shirt, with or without logo
- Grey/black trousers
- Grey/black skirt
- Grey/black/white tights
- Black school shoes Velcro. (no sports trainers)
- Socks to be either black, grey or white
- Grey/black pinafore dress

<u>Summer</u>

- Burgundy/red gingham or burgundy/red and white striped summer dress
- Grey/black shorts





Please put your child's name in ALL clothing.

Each day your child will have the opportunity to learn outdoors so please dress them appropriately for all weathers.

Aprons will always be available but please understand children will get messy as they experiment, explore and learn.





Our Uniform Guide Havi that is Headscarves may be Extreme haviouts eg. shaven heads, tram-lines are not allowed. shoulder length worn for religious must be fully tied back. reasons these should be plain, - grey, white, black or burgundy Jewellery Gold polo shirt A watch (nonbeeping) and simple, stud earrings. (These need taking out for P.E) School Bags -asmall drawstring Joag for PE. and their book bag. Grey | Black Trousers, shorts Grey Black skurts or punafor Trousers or Tights socks should be plain grey! black! Shorts Boots and wellies burgundy white Sensible dark shoes (only for rainy or make-up isn't allowed nust bring shoes or no trouners this includes fake takkos and nail polish, Wear P.E. pungs



What happens in Nursery?

- Predominantly child led learning of research with adult interaction. In Nursery, areas include: sand, water, small world, creative, writing, role play, lose parts, reading and messy play.
- Children learn through play, selecting where they want to play. Adults move learning on through questioning and quality interactions.
- Balance of carpet times, free choice and outdoor play with some adult led activities.



Key Person

"A **key person** is a named member of staff with responsibilities for a small group of children who helps those children in the group feel safe and cared for."

When all children have settled, they will be put into groups and be assigned a key person.





Times of the Day



- Doors open at 8:40am.
- Register is taken at 8:50am prompt.
- If your child arrives after 8:50am, you must take them to be signed in at the school office.
- EYFS Lunch time 11:45am 12:45pm.
- Home time 3:15pm. Please collect your child from the Early Years playground.



<u>Attendance</u>



- Attendance is monitored as it is extremely important – even in Nursery.
- Children are rewarded for good attendance.
- If your child is ill, please contact the school office before 9:30am.
- If your child is sick or has an upset stomach or they must be kept at home for 48 hours.
- If your child becomes ill at Nursery, you will be contacted via phone to come and collect them.



Medicines / First Aid

• If your child is well enough to come to school but needs medicine during the school day, you need to fill in a medicine form at the office. All medication must be handed in to the school office and not left with your child.

Please note:

 We can only give prescribed medication to a child. Medicines given to the office must have correct labelling of your child's name from GP or Pharmacy on medication packaging.



Lunch



- Nursery children can pay for a school meal.
- All dinners are cooked in our school kitchen and each day there is a choice of hot meals, including meat, vegetarian and halal options, vegetables and a salad bar. There is then a choice of desserts.
- You MUST let us know of any dietary requirements, allergies or intolerances.
 These will be discussed with kitchen staff who are able to cater for more dietary needs.
- Raddlebarn promotes healthy eating. We request that packed lunches only contain ONE less healthy option e.g crisps or a small chocolate bar.
- We are a **NUT FREE** school due to children with severe allergies. Please do not send your child to school with any food items containing nuts.

<u>Snack During the Day</u>



- Free Fruit ~ All children in Nursery, receive a piece of free fruit. In Nursery snack is self-service meaning children can decide when they want to eat it.
- Milk ~ Milk is free for children under 5 so your child will be entitled to a free carton of milk each day.
- Water bottles ~ We encourage the children to drink water at school. Your child will be given a Raddlebarn water bottle when they begin.



Parent Pay

- Raddlebarn is a 'cashless school'.
- Any event or item that requires a payment, it can be paid for via Parent Pay.
- This may include: school dinners, milk and trips.



Once your child begins school you will be provided access and a username.



Assemblies

- Once children have settled into Nursery, they will be invited to one assembly per week, the rewards assembly.
- The rewards assembly takes place each Friday at 9am. Parents are very welcome!
- If your child receives a 'Special Mention', you will be sent a text message inviting you and family members to see them receive the award during the Friday assembly.






<u>Homework</u>
