Hello and welcome to our Enterprise and Citizenship activities at Raddlebarn. I am delighted to be able to share some of these activities with you.

Our Enterprise and Citizenship activities are so important in helping us develop the skills that the children need in order to become responsible citizens of the future. We also aim to encourage the children to care about the lives of people in their community and the wider world, to want to protect and care for the environment and to understand that they can make a difference to their local community.

#### Creating the citizens of the future...

At Raddlebarn we focus on two strands of Enterprise.

- 1. Social Enterprise We challenge pupils to research and identify a social or environmental issue that they feel passionate about. Issues could be anything from social isolation of the elderly, the problem of litter in the local area or helping the homeless. The children then work together to try to improve these issues through social action, this could be through raising awareness, fundraising or taking practical action. Some activities also include organising social events for our families and local community to engage in.
- 2. Fundraising Enterprise Children are challenged to raise funds for their own class. They learn about responsibility and learn key skills which they will use later in life, such as working with a budget and managing money. Here are a few of the activities that the children carried out...
